


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REPORT OF THE CHAIRPERSON

Commitment to the Financial Well-Being of our Communities

In 2022, we launched Achieve@Collins, a financial toolkit built to help members who need additional guidance to stabilize and build their financial foundation. The Collins Simple Account is a checking account with no surprise overdrafts or unexpected fees, making it easy for our members to manage their money. The Credit Builder loan helps establish new credit or repair credit, with flexible payment terms and a fixed loan rate. In addition, we offer resources like Greenpath, free one-on-one financial counseling, and Zogo, a gamified way to take bite-sized financial courses.

We were proud to host our second annual Juneteenth event at the 1800 1st Avenue NE location in Cedar Rapids, welcoming blackowned businesses, community partners, live entertainment, and kids' activities. Our continual involvement in community initiatives, charitable contributions, and partnerships with local organizations have reinforced our role as a responsible corporate citizen, striving to make a positive impact on the lives of those we serve.

Focus on Youth and Young Adults

We launched new programs focused on youth and college students. The Hub, located at our 1800 1st Ave NE location, is a fun, safe environment to help youth learn key life skills, including financial wellness, arts, and music. Through partnerships with the Eastern Iowa Arts Academy, Tanager Place, Empowering Youths of lowa, and UnityPoint Health, we are able to deliver rich programs to middle school youth to ignite their full potential.

In 2022, we launched our Collins Scholarship Program. We awarded \$17,500 in scholarships through this program. The essay question was: How do you view and relate to money, and how does that influence your spending and saving choices? We proudly read over 115 essays to narrow them down to four high school senior winners and three undergraduate winners.

Looking ahead, we remain committed to our strategic goals and vision for the future. We will continue to leverage technology, expand our digital offerings, and enhance our member-centric approach to ensure that we meet the evolving needs and expectations of our members. By staying true to our core values and embracing innovation, we are confident in our ability to navigate any challenges that lie ahead and seize opportunities for growth.
